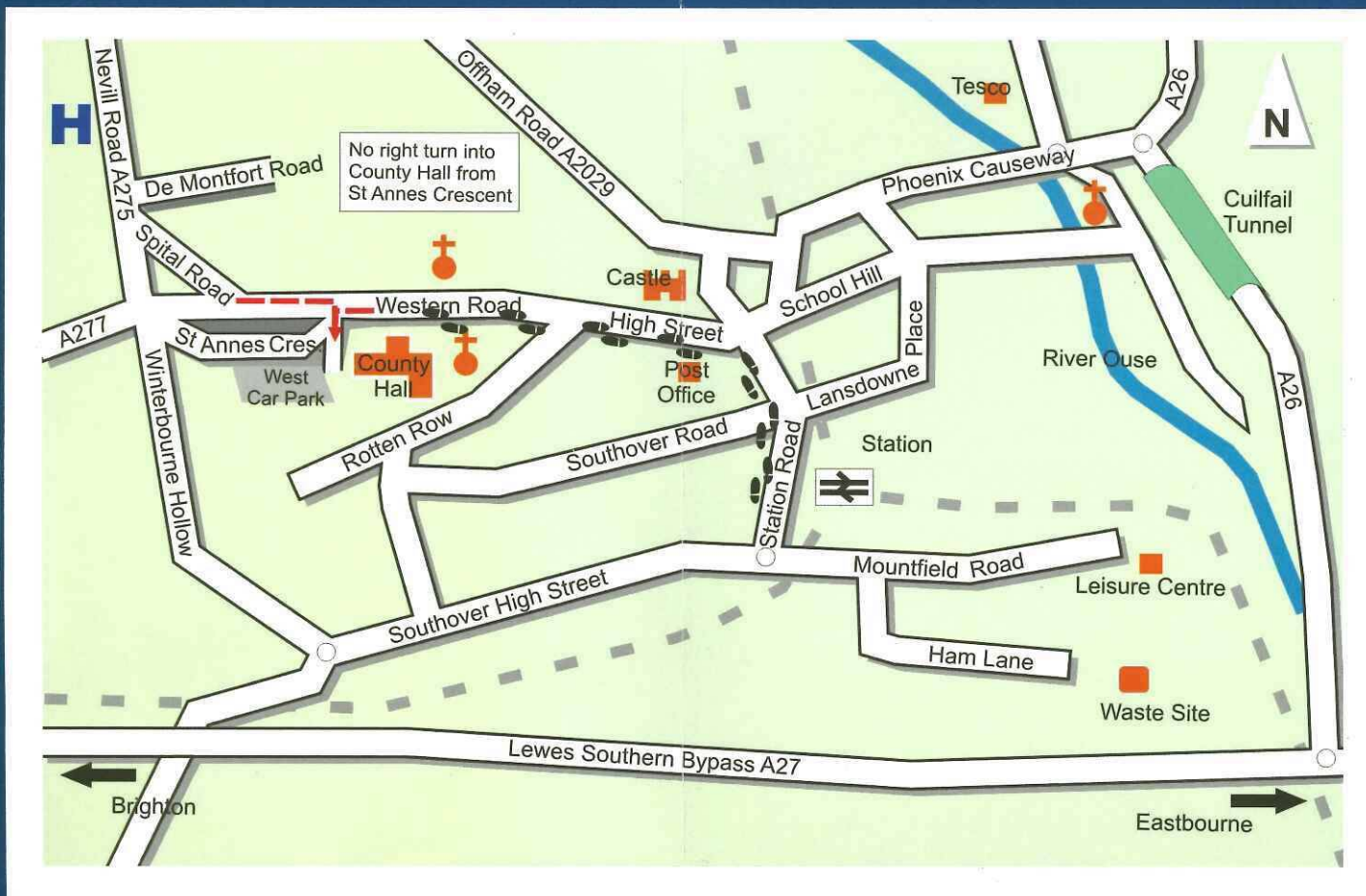


Getting to County Hall

By train

There are regular train services to Lewes from:

- London Victoria
- Portsmouth, Chichester and Brighton
- Hastings and Eastbourne
- Seaford and Newhaven

There is a taxi rank adjacent to the station.

County Hall is approximately 1km from Lewes station. If you are walking, turn right as you leave the station and walk up Station Street. Turn left at the top of the hill onto the High Street. County Hall is about a 10-minute walk, at the top of the hill. The main entrance to County Hall is behind the Parish Church of St Anne, access is via the lane next to the church.

By bus

Travelling from the east, get off at the Pelham Arms pub and take the path through St Anne's churchyard to County Hall. From the west get off at the Black Horse pub and cross the road to County Hall.

Cycling

There is ample secure cycle parking at the entrance to County Hall.

By road

From the direction of Tunbridge Wells

Follow the A26 until you reach the Cuilfail roundabout at eastern end of Lewes. Take the second exit and follow the road (A2029) over the river.

At the main traffic lights (outside Boots) turn right onto School Hill (A277). Follow the road until you reach St Anne's Church at the western end of the town. At the traffic lights turn left onto the County Hall campus.

From the direction of Haywards Heath

Follow the A275 south into Lewes and take the second left into Spital Road after the zebra crossing outside the hospital. Continue into Western Road and turn right at the traffic lights by the Black Horse pub into the County Hall campus.

From the direction of Newhaven

Follow the C7 into Lewes and turn left onto Bell Lane and then right onto the High Street (A277) at the traffic lights by the prison. Follow the road into Lewes and turn right at the Black Horse pub traffic lights into the County Hall campus.

Alternatively, you can follow the A26 and join the A27 at the Beddingham roundabout. Take the first exit and follow the A27 to the Ashcombe roundabout. Take the third exit (A277) to Lewes and follow this road past the prison towards the town centre. At the traffic lights by the Black Horse pub take the right turn into the County Hall campus.

From the direction of Eastbourne

Follow the A27 to the Ashcombe roundabout and take the third exit (A277) to Lewes. Follow this road past the prison towards the town centre. At the traffic lights by the Black Horse pub take the right turn into the County Hall campus.

From the direction of Brighton and the A23

Follow the A27 to the Ashcombe roundabout and take the first exit (A277) to Lewes. Follow this road past the prison towards the town centre. At the traffic lights by the Black Horse pub take the right turn into the County Hall campus.

Visitor parking

When you arrive at the County Hall campus turn right into the **west car park**. There are 12 short-stay (2 hour) bays to the right as you enter the car park. You can also park in any other bays (with the exception of the car share spaces which are reserved for staff use).

Car parks at County Hall operate on a pay and display basis and are managed by NSL Services Ltd. Please buy sufficient time at the pay and display machine when you arrive. There is also pay and display on-street parking available close to County Hall.

To avoid a penalty charge notice, please do not park in any other car park unless specifically directed to reserved spaces.

Disabled parking and access

Disabled drivers are able to park in any available space if they are displaying a blue badge. There are disabled spaces available directly in front of the entrance to County Hall. There are also disabled bays in the east car park.

There is ramp access to reception and there are lifts to all floors. Disabled toilets are available on the ground floor.
